Further investigations showed that his bladder muscles had thickened even further, and in autumn 2015, the pediatric urologist recommended proceeding with surgery; Mitrofanoff procedure with augmentation of the bladder. The aim of the surgery would be to relieve bladder pressure and eventually enable him to go to the toilet successfully.

Isaac's parents were concerned. The Mitrofanoff procedure is complex surgery, and it would mean that Isaac would have to learn how to catheterize. It was at this point that his parents decided to take advantage of the Best Doctors benefit that was available to them, to find out the full implications of the surgery they were being recommended.
